For 10 Agreement to care for a horse without owning it	Lease
For 20 Takes in Unwanted Horses	Horse Rescue
For 30 Local Animal Welfare Organization	Humane Society
For 40 Charity classification 501C with public accountability	Non-Profit
For 50 Maximum number of animals the facility can maintain	Capacity
Lesson 6 To Be or Not to Be a Horse Owner	
For 10 Typically 10'x10' or 12'x12'	Stall
For 20 Service to provide care and maintenance to horse for a fee	Boarding
For 30 Water a horse consumes a day on average	10-12 gallons
For 40 Percentage of body weight needed daily for forage	1 – 1.5%
For 50 Providing all the elements of a horses needs for care and management.	Responsible Ownership
